Subject: RX Spray N Go use in electrostatic sprayers and foggers

The EPA recently revised its guidance for the use of disinfectant products with electrostatic sprayer's and fogging units. We have had a lot of questions concerning the use of the RX Spray N Go with these devices so we are happy to share this information and our position on the subject.

The new EPA statement reads as follows:

A disinfectant product's safety and effectiveness may change based on how you use it. If a pesticide product's label does not include disinfection directions for use with fogging, fumigation, wide-area, or electrostatic spraying, EPA has not reviewed any data on whether the product is safe and effective when used by those methods.

Based on the new position from EPA, Bullen does not see any issue with using RX Spray N Go with electrostatic sprayers since they are just a battery-assisted pump dispensing system. The most important thing to do is follow the required dwell time for the kill claims you are trying to achieve. RX Spray N Go's dwell time is 5 minutes.

Bullen customers are aware of our opinion of electrostatic sprayers in general since we sell our own non-electric sprayers systems. You can find that information at on our program at: https://www.bullenonline.com/pathogencontrol/

Bullen <u>does not recommend the use of any of its disinfectants through foggers</u>. Foggers present many issues that involve the health of the people using the products and others due to possible inhalation, dwell time and surface coverage.
